## **The Bob Whyte Trophy – for athletic achievement**

This award is made to a club member who has made a significant personal achievement during the year. Examples would be a notable improvement in racing performance, or attaining a personal goal.

## **The Cath Hulme Men’s & Women’s Trophies – for athletic excellence**

This trophy is awarded for achieving a high standard of athletic performance in any area of the sport – road, cross country or track. Such performances might include gaining high overall or age category positions in open events or championships, setting Club records or winning county, area or national championship medals.

### **The Foord Multisport Trophy– for achievement in triathlons and duathlons**

This award is made to a Club member who has made a significant personal achievement or achieved a high standard of athletic excellence in triathlon or duathlon events.
